What is the Dwight D. Eisenhower Transportation Fellowship Program?

Eligibility Requirements

You must be:

- Pursuing a degree in a <u>transportation-related discipline</u>
- Enrolled in a full-time program for the entire academic year
- Conducting ongoing research in one or more transportationrelated disciplines
- Planning to enter the transportation profession after completing the degree

Can foreign students apply?

► Yes, but...

- ► If you are not a U.S. citizen:
 - You must provide valid copy of student I-20 ID from UNM or I-551 Permanent Resident Card
- If you are a graduate student:
 - You must have bachelor's degree from an Institution of Higher Education (IHE) accredited by federally-recognized accrediting agency
 - Your IHE must be located (physically and administratively) within United States or its territories

Allowable Research Topics

- Your research can address:
 - Any transportation mode (bus, auto, walking, air freight, trucks, drones, etc.)
 - Any topic related to transportation in a meaningful way
 - Examples: environmental impacts, social impacts, traveler safety, vehicle energy use, transportation funding, etc.

Program Requirements

- All fellowship recipients must:
 - 1. Prepare a thesis/dissertation or research paper
 - Topic \rightarrow must relate directly to a transportation problem or issue
 - Faculty advisor \rightarrow must approve the topic
 - 2. Attend the Annual Meeting of the Transportation Research Board (TRB)
 - <u>TRB Annual Meeting</u> → takes place in Washington, D.C. (January12–16, 2020)
 - 3. Be prepared to present on research project
 - At UNM and possibly at TRB Annual Meeting

Fellowship Application

- A complete student application consists of the following:
 - 1. Student File Information Sheet
 - 2. Application for Federal Assistance (Form: SF 424 Individual)
 - 3. Personal Statement
 - 4. Research Plan & Impact Statement
 - 5. Résumé
 - 6. Letters of Recommendation (at least 2, one from faculty member who will oversee your work)
 - 7. Official Transcripts

Form SF-424

- We'll fill in as much as possible for you
 - Check website for updated versions
- In the meantime, use these input values:
 - Date received: June 7, 2019
 - Project start date: August 19, 2019
 - Project end date: August 16, 2020

Personal Statement

- Your Personal Statement should include:
 - relevant information about your background, your educational and professional development plans, and your career goals
- It should describe how your education will prepare you for a career in transportation
- Limit = 8000 characters (including both words and spaces)

Research Plan & Impact Statement

- Your Research Plan & Impact Statement should summarize:
 - Both your plan of study and your research plan
- You should describe how your research will:
 - Impact and enhance the field of transportation
 - Contribute to an understanding of transportation
 - Provide societal benefits
- Remember, your proposed research <u>must</u> be conducted in one of the approved transportation-related academic disciplines (there is a link to the list on our website)
- Limit = 8000 characters (including both words and spaces)
